

## Equality information and objectives 2022-2024

The Equality Act 2010 replaced all existing equality legislation such as the Race Relations Act, Disability Discrimination Act and Sex Discrimination Act.

The Equality Act 2010 requires all schools to comply with the Public Sector Equality Duty and two specific duties.

The Public Sector Equality Duty is a duty on public bodies and others carrying out public functions. It ensures that public bodies consider the needs of all individuals in their day to day work- in shaping policy, in delivering services, and in relation to their own employees. It covers the following protected characteristics:

- Age
- Disability
- Gender
- Ethnicity
- Pregnancy and Maternity
- · Religion and Belief
- Sexual Orientation
- Transgender
- Marriage and Civil Partnership

The Public Sector Equality Duty requires a school to publish information that demonstrates that we have due regard for the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct prohibited by the Equality Act 2010
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and people who
  do not share it.
