

Dear Parents and Carers,

The week started with a very thoughtful and thought provoking assembly on Remembrance Day presented by Year 3C. I would like to thank the parents who made the effort to attend the Monday assembly. It means so much to your children when you are able to attend. Monday was also BAFTA Roadshow day at Chalkhill Primary School. The Year 3 to Year 6 children were treated to a special assembly, attended workshops and participated in question and answer sessions. The organisers of the event informed me how impressed they were with our pupils mature behaviour, their politeness and their engagement with the varies tasks. It was very pleasing to hear.

Throughout the week, a number of classes have been on trips to the cinema. We encourage these experiences to support the learning of local geography, as well as road safety education and opportunities for writing with a purpose. Here are two reviews:

Year 6 will be attending a workshop organised by the local authority at the Civic Centre. Throughout the week, children will have additional PSHE sessions linked to anti-bullying and explore the theme of Aspirations. Aspirations will also be the theme of Friday's assembly, which will be presented by the children in Mrs Hussein's class (2H).

On Thursday, we are presenting an exhibition of the work that was completed during Black History Month this year, based on the theme: Saluting Our Sisters. The exhibition will be presented in our assembly hall. Parents are invited to come and visit the exhibition. 



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
