Head lice and nits are common in children and families. transmitted through head-to-head contact, not related to hair cleanliness.

Hay fever is a type of allergic reaction usually worse between late March and September when the pollen count is at its highest, It usually affect the nose, face, eyes, throat,

### HOW TO MANAGE HAY FEVER?

- Put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap pollen
- Wear sunglasses to stop pollen getting into your eyes
- Shower and change your clothes to wash pollen off
   Stay indoors if possible
- Keep doors and windows close as much as possible.
- Vacuum and dust regularly


