This week, Year 3 went on a trip to Willesden Library to experience a workshop on Ancient Egyptians. On page three, you will see the pictures and read the comments from some of the children.

Year 5 and Year 6 took part in a workshop by a Theatre Company called Whisper Me Happy Ever After. Through drama, the actors raise awareness of domestic violence and what to do if a child is experiencing upsetting situations at home or the wider community. This is done sensitively and in a very supportive manner. I would like to share some feedback from the students with you:


#### Year 5:

"I have learned to be brave and share worries"; "I've learned that you should tell someone when something is wrong"; "I learned that it is okay for brother and sister to fight and it is not okay to do domestic abuse"; "I have learned that you should always tell someone when you need help"; "I learned more about domestic abuse and abuse and that you can call trusted people like Childline 08001111 or if it's a website it could be Kooth.com. And please go to therapy or a trusted

person if this happens to you."

#### Year 6:

'Whisper Me Happy' was a workshop about domestic violence that showed us that someone may look okay from the outside, but anything could be going on whether at home or at school and that you should not judge them just because they may look a certain way. If something is going on at home, you should tell someone because it can help a lot and that keeping it to yourself is not always the only option and it is not the best option either. There is always someone to talk to, whether it be, Place2Be, a family member, your class teacher, the safeguarding team, or a friend. Keeping it to yourself can make you even more stressed and the more you share, the more worries fade away and slowly but surely, you'll eventually feel better.



Next week, the Year 5 children will be experiencing an amazing physics workshop on Monday and Tuesday. We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday. Your child is invited to come **dressed as a character** out of their favourite book. We are also putting on our very popular pancake breakfast. Tickets can be bought via parent pay. On Friday, 8th March, Chalkhill will be hosting the Biggest Ever Let Girls Play Football tournament. We are expecting a number of Brent Schools to come and join us for this event. The assembly on Friday will be presented by 1Z and will celebrate Mothers Day. On Friday, after school, there are two discost aking place to raise funds for enrichment activities for the children. Tickets are available on parent pay. KS1 children do not need any additional money. A 'goodie bag' is included in the ticket. We invite KS2 children to bring in some money, as there will be snack shop arranged for them.

Currently, in history, year 3 are learning about Ancient Egypt. Therefore, as part of our history topic, we visited Willesden Library to learn about how ancient Egyptian artefacts came to be in Brent Museum and about mummification methods of 'wrapping' amulets around a doll with linen bandages. We had the opportunity to explore books and artefacts and even participate in activities related to ancient Egyptian culture and history. Studying ancient civilisations like Egypt provided valuable insights into the past and helped us better understand different cultures and societies.





My favourite part was when we made amulets using foam clay. I had made an amulet that looked like an eye which is one of the most popular amulets in ancient Egypt called the wedjat eye.

My favourite part was when we had to wrapped the mummy doll in linen to represent mummification. We had placed amulets in their correct places to show how they prepared for after life.


