Dear Parents and Carers,

The focus this week has been on celebrating Neurodiversity Awareness under the umbrella message of Minds of all Kinds. At the start of the week, Ms Whittingham, our Autism Champion, presented an informative assembly to raise awareness of some of the challenges faced by children (and adults) with neurodiversity, such as ASD and ADHD. Throughout the week, activities were provided to the class teachers to continue to build the knowledge and understanding of pupils and staff. We aim to create a greater sense of tolerance and respect for children and adults with neurodiversity in our community.

Our Year 5 children continue to enjoy the Aerial Workshop to experience different forces on their bodies. I am very grateful to Ms To, who organised this amazing opportunity for our children before she left Chalkhill.



Today, year 2A presented their outstanding art work related to their history studies of the Great Fire of London.

The silhouette pictures on orange, yellow and red background were very impressive and reflected what that night of the fire must have been like. Thank you to the parents who were able to attend the assembly. It means such a lot to your children, when you are able to attend.

For safeguarding reasons, we are making a change to how we dismiss children from the school office. If you have to collect your child early for an appointment or if you are late collecting your child at the end of the school day, **you must sign the children out on the inventory system**. If you are not sure what this is or how to do it, ask the office staff, who can help you.

Next week is the last week of the Spring Term. I cannot believe we have made it to the end of the second school term. Just one more term to go. On Wednesday, the children are invited to come in their own (brightly coloured) clothes to take part in the fun run Sprint into Spring. We are asking for a £1 donation, which will go in equal parts to Comic Relief and towards raising awareness of neurodiversity. The children should be wearing trainers on the day to participate in the fun run. On Thursday, the last day of the spring term, Year 4 will be presenting an Easter assembly in the sports hall. You are also invited to join us for the Spring term music concert on Monday at 13:45 hours. If your child has attended the Monday Drama Club, there will be a performance after school, that you may wish to come and see.

The children are expected to return to school on Monday, 15th April 2024. The gates will open at 08:30 as usual.

On Tuesday, 16th April, Mrs Mallek will be presenting an Eid assembly. This will be followed by an Eid Celebration Breakfast. Your children are welcome to come into school in their celebration clothes, should they wish to do so. No fancy dress costumes, please, either for the fun run next week or for the Eid breakfast after the holidays.

Who can attend

To be eligible for a free place, children and young people must currently be:

- in Reception to Year 11 (inclusive); and
- a resident in Brent and/or attending a Brent school; and
- receiving benefits-related free school meals (FSM) or have had their eligibility confirmed by a professional.

Please note that benefits-related free school meals are separate to the universal infant free school meals (UIFSM) scheme, which provides children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 with free school meals. Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who receive free school meals must also be **eligible for benefits-related free school meals** in order to access a free place on the HAF programme.

There are currently universal [free school meals](#) for all primary school children in state-funded schools for the 2023/24 academic year. This is funded through the Mayor of London.

Proof of eligibility

When booking a place, you will be asked to confirm your eligibility by:

- showing a copy of your school holiday supermarket voucher email (vouchers are emailed from your school)
- quoting your supermarket voucher eCode; or providing a confirmation of eligibility (such as an email, letter, or code) from your school, social worker, youth worker or other professional.

If you believe your child is eligible for the HAF programme but do not have proof of eligibility, please speak to the relevant holiday club provider when booking a place, and they will be able to assist you.

Siblings

Siblings of children who meet the above criteria may also be able to access Brent HAF programme places, please speak to the relevant holiday club provider and they will be able to assist you.

What is Cygnet?

Cygnet is a parenting support programme created by leading children's charity Barnardo's. It aims to support parents and/carers of children and young people who have a diagnosis of Autism or autistic traits. The course is delivered by practitioners who have experience of working with neurodivergent children and the programme aims to work towards supporting and developing the young person's social communication skills and behaviour.



Is Cygnet for me?

When you have a child or children who have traits of neurodiversity, sometimes it can feel lonely or isolating and you might feel you need some more expert advice.

Children's needs also change over time and information and advice received when a child is younger may need to be updated to be relevant for the child/young person today.

Attending Cygnet gives parents and carers an opportunity to develop their understanding of autism and look at practical solutions to managing behaviour.

It also gives you the chance to meet other people in a similar position and hear about their experiences in an informal but supportive atmosphere.



ZERO HOUR CARETAKER/CLEANER MAINTENANCE ROLE TO COVER HIRE OF PREMISES

The Governing Board of Chalkhill Primary School are looking for a committed and conscientious person(s) to cover a caretaker/cleaning maintenance role during any letting of the premises.

We need a competent person who is able to work in a Caretaker/Cleaner Maintenance role:

1) Term time hour:

Part-time evening (anytime from 4.30pm to 11.00pm)

And/or Saturday (anytime from 9.00am to 11.30pm.

And/or Sunday (anytime 9.00am to 11.00pm)

2) School Holidays:

Anytime between 8.00am to 11.00pm Monday to Friday and/or

Anytime between 8.00am to 11.30pm Saturday.

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You will be required to manage our evening, weekend lettings and school holiday hire. 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JOB DESCRIPTION FOR CARETAKER/CLEANER FOR A ZERO HOUR CONTRACT

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The role includes:

- Being a key holder and recognising the responsibilities that this entails such as out-of-hours opening and locking of the venue and the ability to be the emergency 'on call' contact for hirers.
- Setting up and taking down tables and chairs as per the diary's requirements.
- Laying carpet in specific areas if necessary.
- Checking the building after hirers.
- Checking regularly for H&S or repair issues.
- Oversee the car park during and after the event.
- Undertake any additional cleaning required over and above the commercial cleaning routine.
- Demonstrating the use of equipment to hirers.
- Assisting hirers with any unplanned issues or requirements during their hire session.
- Be willing to undertake training that is appropriate to the role. For example, manual handling training, health and safety training, fire marshals training (this list is not exhaustive).
- Being aware of and working to COSHH.
- Work to a flexible and adaptable timetable.
- Excellent time keeping.
- Knowledge of Health and Safety responsibilities.
- Knowledge of evacuation procedures for the site.
- Basic DIY and maintenance experience an advantage.
- Additional duties as determined by the Bursar and Site Manager.
